A phobia is defined as an irrational, intense fear of an object or situation that poses little or no actual danger At first glance, a phobia may seem similar to a normal fear, but it's is the degree to which a person is affected that determines whether that fear has become a phobia

Severity Measure for Specific Phobia Adult This measure ...

The Severity Measure for Specific Phobia—Adult is a 10-item measure that assesses the severity of specific phobia in individuals age 18 and older The measure was designed to be completed by an individual upon receiving a diagnosis of specific phobia (or clinically significant specific phobia symptoms) and thereafter, prior to follow-up
